



# Growing trees and flowing streams

The concept combines three themes, each represented by a visual element:

- Trees, symbolized by year rings
- Water, symbolized by ripples
- Meeting point, symbolized by a radar signal

They all come together in the logo and in the landscape.

At the core of the project lies the idea of a blue-green meeting point for the surrounding area in Floridsdorf. Today, there is a lack of green parks and recreational spaces, and the project aims to address this need.

There are multiple zones within the project: a zen zone provides space to sit in the shade of trees and listen to the sound of flowing water. A collective kitchen garden is situated near the gastro area, offering locals the opportunity to garden, sow, and reap. Safely enclosed by trees, there is a water playground where children can have fun. In addition to these, there is a guest garden, an artist area for exhibitions, etc., and a large open space allowing for a variety of uses. All the zones are connected by a meandering stream that flows through the landscape.

Existing trees have largely been preserved. All new trees planted are considered climate trees, and the specific species used are Pin Oak 'Green Pillar,' Norway Maple, Speckled Alder, Common Acacia 'Fresia,' and Ginkgo biloba. The flower beds incorporate native and pollinator-friendly flowers and plants, supporting biodiversity.

In addition to grass and plants, the materials used in the project are compact gravel road, rounded paving stones, permeable pavers, and glass cement/'Ferrock.' This sustainable material use allows water to seep into the ground. On the square, interchanging circles of gravel and rounded paving stones create a distinct pattern reflecting the concept.

Some of the biodiversity efforts in the project include insect hotels in the flower beds, birdhouses in the wilderness area, an old log, and a biodiversity roof on the old factory building.

The furniture chosen for the project includes the Vestre STOOP, APRIL GO chairs, and VROOM modules.
